

Grace Kindeke is an artist, activist, community organizer and a B.A. student of Africana Studies and Sociology at UMASS Boston. She is a fierce advocate for justice and liberation, grounding her work in an intersectional, Black feminist, African-futurist, and anti-oppression practice.

Born in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Grace immigrated to the U.S. as a toddler and grew up in New

Hampshire. Having spent much of her life in the Granite State, she moved to Boston, MA where she lived for several years before returning to her hometown of Manchester with her husband in 2018.

As the NH Program Coordinator for the American Friends Service committee, Grace has shown leadership, empathy and conviction to support and work alongside and on behalf of historically marginalized communities including: undocumented and detained immigrants, asylum seekers, refugees, Black and Brown communities as well as currently and formerly incarcerated people and their loved ones. She is currently working to end the discriminatory Title 42 policy and restore asylum in the US; advocating for a more just and humane immigration system and using art to engage, educate and empower communities to take action. As a Black woman, an African immigrant, and a former DREAMER, Grace shares her powerful voice and unique perspective to call for transformative change through solidarity, community care and unapologetic truth telling in New Hampshire, and beyond.
