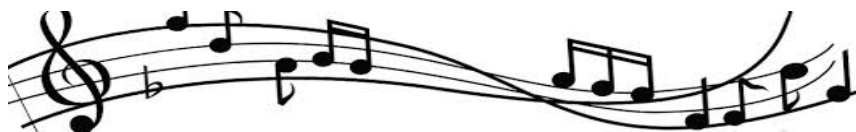

2026 MLK Jr. Award

Recipient: The Honorable Melanie Levesque

Melanie Ann Levesque was born in the [Boston](#) neighborhood of [Roxbury](#). She earned an [A.A.](#) from New Hampshire Vocational-Technical College, a [B.S.](#) from [Daniel Webster College](#), and an [M.B.A.](#) from [Southern New Hampshire University](#). Hon. Melanie Levesque holds the historic distinction of being the first African American State Senator in New Hampshire. She represented District 12, which spans from Nashua to Rindge, during her tenure from 2018 to 2020. During her time in the State Senate, Melanie Levesque served as the Chair of the Election Law and Municipal Affairs Committee. She also contributed her expertise as a member of the Senate Judiciary and Transportation Committees. Her legislative career began in the New Hampshire House of Representatives, where she served from 2006 to 2010 and again from 2012 to 2014. While in the House, she was appointed to the Election Law Committee as well as the Science, Technology, and Energy Committee. A tireless advocate for her community, Melanie Levesque has championed essential causes including voting rights, the availability of quality public education for every child, affordable and accessible healthcare, environmental sustainability with an emphasis on renewable energy, public safety, and retirement security. Notably, she sponsored and successfully passed legislation to establish the Statewide Emergency Notification System for New Hampshire.

Beyond her legislative work, Melanie Levesque has played significant roles within the New Hampshire Democratic Party, serving as Director of Outreach from 2021 to 2022. She is currently the Chair for the Brookline Democrats, Chair of the NHDP African American Caucus, and served as NAACP Freedom Fund Dinner Co-Chair in 2024 and 2025. Her dedication to civic engagement is further demonstrated by her previous involvement with NH Civics, the NH Women's Foundation, the New Hampshire Endowment for Health Advisory Committee, and her service as a Trustee for the Town of Brookline.

Melanie is the President of TCS of America Enterprises, LLC, a telecommunications consulting firm, she and her sister Cindy Perkins own. Having grown up in Nashua, Melanie now resides in Brookline, New Hampshire, with her husband Scott.

The MLK Jr. Coalition is honored to present the 2026 MLK Jr. Award to the Honorable Melanie Levesque who epitomizes the spirit of Dr. King's work.

2026 Vanessa Washington-Johnson Bloeman Award

Recipient: Representative Alice Wade

This award is given to recognize and encourage emerging leaders in movements in social justice. Representative Alice Wade is an aerospace engineer who moved to Dover shortly after graduating from the University of New Hampshire with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. Alice is the Founder of the Sally Ride Fellowship, a program that helps connect underrepresented students with internships in the aerospace industry. She was elected to the NH House of Representatives in 2024 and is currently serving Dover Ward 2, Strafford's 15th District. Her top priorities in office are to create more affordable housing, make childcare and healthcare more accessible, and work to address the climate crisis. Alice has been involved as the Vice Chair of the Dover Committee for Racial Equity and Inclusion since 2023. She continues to serve on the Strafford County Democrats Executive Committee (2024 to present).

As an openly transgender person, Alice has already faced down discrimination at the State House with courage and dignity. She is a model of grace, fortitude and honesty. She is indeed a person to watch, support and champion in the years to come.

Our congratulations to Representative Alice Wade on this honor in the name of another pioneer and activist.
